Big Island Driving — Quick Reference Card

When You Should Pull Over

- 1 Two or more cars stacking up behind you
- 2 Long, winding, or narrow roads
- 3 Limited or no passing lanes
- 4 You're driving slower than traffic flow

How to Pull Over Safely

- 1 Use marked pullouts when available
- 2 Pull fully off the roadway
- 3 Signal early and clearly
- 4 Re-enter traffic only when clear

What NOT to Do

- 1 Don't stop in travel lanes
- 2 Don't brake suddenly
- 3 Don't block bridges or blind curves
- 4 Don't feel pressured — safety first

Why This Matters

Pulling over keeps traffic moving smoothly and helps everyone — visitors and locals — get home safely.
