

Responsible Visitor Checklist – Big Island

Mālama 'Āina (Care for the Land)

- Stay on marked trails and roads
- Pack out all trash and recyclables
- Do not remove rocks, plants, or cultural items
- Avoid disturbing native vegetation or fragile ecosystems

Respect Private Property

- Do not trespass on private land
- Follow posted signs and local guidance
- Ask permission if unsure about access

Wildlife Safety

- Observe wildlife from a distance (minimum 50 feet for sea turtles, 150 feet for monk seals)
- Do not feed animals (including birds, pigs, or goats)
- Keep dogs leashed or secured to protect wildlife and livestock

Small Actions That Make a Big Difference

- Use reusable water bottles and containers
- Minimize single-use plastics wherever possible
- Support local businesses respectfully and learn about the community

- Share the land responsibly with other visitors; be patient and courteous
